CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL OF YOU AND A REMINDER TO ALL WHO ARE WORKING TOWARD TITLES THIS YEAR. PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT THERE HAS BEEN A CHANGE TO THE AWARDS SCHEDULE AS OF JANUARY 1, 2008. PLEASE CHECK BACK ISSUES OF WAGGIN' TALES FROM THE FALL OF 2007AND THE BEGINNING OF THIS YEAR FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE THE BACK ISSUES THEY CAN BE FOUND ON THE www.fvdtc.org WEBSITE.

REMEMBER: IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR ANY OF THE AWARDS, YOU NEED TO HELP SUPPORT THE CLUB BY OBTAINING WORK CREDITS. THE WORK CREDITS ARE GIVEN TO INDIVIDUALS WHO HELP VARIOUS COMMITTEES WITH THEIR JOBS. IT IS PEOPLE LIKE YOU VOLUNTEERING THAT KEEPS THIS CLUB VIABLE. WE CAN'T DO IT WITHOUT YOUR HELP. EVEN IF YOU DON'T WANT AWARDS YOUR HELP IS NEEDED TO KEEP FVDTC RUNNING.

On Thursday, June 19th FVDTC will be hosting a Sanctioned OB Match. (OB = Obedience B) AKC recognizes several different types of Sanctioned matches (A, B, and C) but the "B" match satisfies most requirements with the least effort and is therefore the most common. A "B" match can have both breed and obedience whereas "OB" is just for obedience. Instead of our regular Correction Clinic in June we will be holding a Sanctioned Match. There will probably be some questions regarding the switch. Hopefully this article will answer those questions.

WHAT IS A SANCTIONED OB MATCH?

AKC defines a Sanctioned OB Obedience Match as an informal event at which dog clubs, judges, stewards, and exhibitors and their dogs gain experience needed for licensed events. AKC obedience regulations apply at Sanctioned Matches. Dog and handler teams will be scored as in an AKC Obedience Trial, however, no points or credit toward an Obedience Title are awarded. Approval from AKC is required to hold an OB Sanctioned Match and the Club will designate a Match Secretary who will assume the duties as a Trial Secretary.

WHY HOLD AN AKC SANCTIONED MATCH?

As mentioned previously it gives the handler and dog, club, stewards and judges the opportunity to gain valuable ring experience. Typically, handlers and dogs are more relaxed in this type of atmosphere than in an actual Trial. It gives them the opportunity to be evaluated and judged against other competitors without the pressures of an actual Trial.

Any person wishing to become an AKC Obedience Judge is required to judge a minimum of 5) novice classes at AKC sanctioned matches prior to submitting their application. A provisional Obedience Judge wishing to move up to the next class is required to judge a minimum of 5) Sanctioned Matches in the class that they are applying for. Sanctioned Matches are necessary in order for the sport to train and obtain new Judges.

AKC has a list of requirements for Clubs to hold future Dog Shows. In order to be licensed to hold a Dog Show the Club must satisfy a minimum of 3 requirements. Hosting an AKC Sanctioned Obedience Match satisfies one of those requirements.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER A SANCTIONED MATCH?

Dogs must be AKC registered and be at least 6 months of age. Dogs with a CDX title may be entered in the Open B class but may not compete for any awards in that class. A dog with a CDX title may compete for awards in a Utility class. Dogs with a UD title may be entered in the Open B and/ or Utility classes but may not compete for any awards in these classes. The Match Secretary, and the match judges and immediate household and family members are not eligible to participate.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A CORRECTION CLINIC AND A SANCTIONED MATCH?

A Correction Clinic is held to allow a handler to <u>train</u> their dog and make suitable corrections as necessary. The Judge of a Correction Clinic may work with the handler on a specific issue, sometimes allowing the team to repeat or modify an exercise.

A Sanctioned Match is held to gain ring experience. Because AKC regulations apply at Sanctioned Matches corrections are <u>NOT</u> allowed. A person that corrects their dog at a Sanctioned Match will receive an NQ for that exercise as in a Trial and may be excused.

HOW DO I ENTER A SANCTIONED MATCH?

Entry to an AKC Sanctioned Match is made by submitting a completed Official Entry Form to the Match Secretary of the Club hosting the event with the proper fee. The Entry Form could be an existing printed form for any AKC Obedience Trial or is available for download from AKC at http://www.akc.org/pdfs/AEN999.pdf. The entry must be complete and include the dog's AKC registration number. Pre-entries are strongly encouraged. Entry may be available until the Sanctioned Match begins providing the classes have not filled or otherwise published.

Hopefully this explains the need and basic rules for Sanctioned Matches. If you have any questions the pamphlet "Match Regulations" is available for download from the AKC website or email obedience@FVDTC.org with your questions.

Thank you for your interest in the Fox Valley Dog Training Club.

Applications for Puppy and Beginner classes are accepted on a first come, first served basis; once a class is full, no other applications can be accepted for that session. Class sizes are limited so that each student can receive as much individual attention as possible. You will be placed in a class as soon as your completed application is received. Please remember that classes fill quickly, so waiting until the last minute to enroll probably means you won't get in.

Our classes are usually held on Thursday evenings. However, due to scheduling conflicts with other activities at the fairgrounds, occasionally your class for the week will be on a Tuesday. Please check the dates of the classes (shown as "Regular Training" on our calendar) against your personal calendar to verify that you will be able to attend each class.

PUPPY CLASS:

Our puppy class is for dogs aged 8 weeks up to 5 months. In the puppy class, you will begin basic training and socialization. You will learn about your puppy and how to care for him or her. The puppy class is for you and your puppy to get adjusted to training and being around other dogs and people. We have started staggering our Puppy classes so there will be one starting each month. There are 8 weeks of classes. Although each session of classes runs 10 weeks, two of those weeks you will not have classes due to our Correction Clinics. The fee for the puppy class is \$75.00.


BEGINNER CLASS

Our beginner class is for dogs aged 5 months and older. In our beginner class you start with beginning obedience such as <u>Heeling</u>, <u>Sit</u>, <u>Down</u>, <u>Stay</u>, <u>Recall</u> (Come), and behaving around people and other dogs. We offer one beginner class at 7:00 p.m., one class at 8:00 p.m. and one class at 9:00 p.m. Each of those classes is 1 hour long. There are 8 weeks of classes. Although each session of classes runs 10 weeks, two of those weeks you will not have classes due to our Correction Clinics. The fee for the beginner class is \$90.00.
