TAKING CARE OF A CUT PAD

Three weeks ago, during some last minute preparation for a hunt test, Peggy cut her pad pretty badly. I washed it with her clean drinking water. Then rinsed it with the saline solution (for contacts) in my F.A. kit. Then, unknowingly, I made a big mistake. I sprinkled "quick-stop" on the cut. Yes she cried but I thought it was worth it. I bandaged it, and since the bleeding had nearly stopped, made the 30 minute drive to my regular vet. I had read that an extremely tight bandage can do great harm, so I used caution here.

Once with the vet I learned the first two steps were correct, but "Quick stop" kills tissue, and now stitches were out of the question. Well, I've also heard stitching a pad is uncommon these days, but I was distressed I had

made a big mistake.

Result: Any future cuts will be handled this way until I learn differently:

Prior to the vet visit and antibiotics

- Clean water, then saline solution (for contacts)
- A non-stick telfa pad, and bandaged firmly.
- Keep the foot clean, and dry (wrapped) and rested, for 3 days.
- For another week, wrap the foot whenever she leaves the house.

It's a great deal of work, but she never went backwards so it is totally worth it.

Always include your name and a phone number with your article.


What Gets Included
