#### **WARNING!!** TO ALL THOSE WHO TRAVEL ANYWHERE WITH THEIR DOGS.

I belong to a Giant Schnauzer internet discussion group. A few weeks ago a member on the list addressed an issue of serious importance for all of us that travel by air (or any other method) with our dogs.

He reported that in a ten day period, he had noted two instances where people flying with their dogs tried to ship the dogs in a kennel wearing prong collars. Fortunately, Bert notified management and the people were required to go and remove the collars.

I had a personal experience with prong collars and crates. I always take off the dogs' collars prior to them jumping into their crates in the van. On one occasion, things did not go well. Xan had just jumped into his crate after I had taken off his collar. Krista was sitting next to me anxious to get in her crate. Very competitive with Xan. As I started to turn to take Krista's collar off, she got too impatient and leapt in before I could grab her. One of those split second situations you wish you could take back. As she was turning in the crate to face me (and I could reach in and get the collar off) her neck skimmed the side of the crate. The collar became caught in the wire on the side.

She was in quite a predicament. It was so tightly caught I couldn't get her unstuck and I couldn't unhook the collar. My greatest fear was that she would start to panic given she was in mid turn and looking like a horseshoe with her head facing her tail.

Luckily, I have a command I use when I need the dogs to stay still. I quietly (frantically in my mind) climbed in as far as I could with her and with force and speed barely managed to get the collar removed. It was shear adrenaline that enabled me to get it off. I seriously was considering the possibility of having to use the wire cutters that I carry in the car. But, feared I didn't have that much time before she would be seriously injured.

It still boggles my mind how she was able to hook on to the side the way she did. A shocking reminder of how fast an incident can happen.

Even though it happened by mistake, it was certainly a confirmation regarding collars and crates.

## FROM RICK COX, OBEDIENCE TRIAL CHAIR, TO YOU

Following is a list of positions available for the November 9th Obedience Trial. I would encourage our members to act quickly and volunteer for the position of their choice as they are going fast! (Right!)

**Trial secretary** - responsible for preparing and mailing premium lists, taking entries, preparing and mailing entry information to handlers, and completion of AKC required documentation.

Booth chairperson - responsible for Vendor booth space.

Ring Steward Chairperson - responsible for arranging stewards for obedience and rally ring.

**Scoring -** responsible for tracking and recording scores the day of the trial.

**Kitchen Chairperson** - responsible for obtaining and organizing help for the kitchen, and for breakfast and lunch preparation, and any kitchen details.

There will be several committees that need help as well as the chairpersons described above. There will be something for everyone!

## **BECAUSE YOU NEED TO KNOW**

Sandi Stephenson, our terrific Director of Training, has NO CONTROL OVER THE PARK LOT SITUATION. Only the Kane County Fairground people have control over the parking lot.

DO NOT PARK AT THE DOORS - you can unload quickly and then go park your car in the appropriate areas. This applies to everyone. It is the Fire Code.

HANDICAP SIGNS FOR PARKING AREAS ARE FOR LEGALLY HANDICAPPED FOLKS USE ONLY. We have members who need these areas to be available to them so they can come to classes and functions of the club. So, when you see these signs out please be respectful and keep the area open so they can use them without difficulty. Your consideration will be appreciated by everyone.

On Thursday, June 19<sup>th</sup> FVDTC will be hosting a Sanctioned OB Match. (OB = Obedience B) AKC recognizes several different types of Sanctioned matches (A, B, and C) but the "B" match satisfies most requirements with the least effort and is therefore the most common. A "B" match can have both breed and obedience whereas "OB" is just for obedience. Instead of our regular Correction Clinic in June we will be holding a Sanctioned Match. There will probably be some questions regarding the switch. Hopefully this article will answer those questions.

#### WHAT IS A SANCTIONED OB MATCH?

AKC defines a Sanctioned OB Obedience Match as an informal event at which dog clubs, judges, stewards, and exhibitors and their dogs gain experience needed for licensed events. AKC obedience regulations apply at Sanctioned Matches. Dog and handler teams will be scored as in an AKC Obedience Trial, however, no points or credit toward an Obedience Title are awarded. Approval from AKC is required to hold an OB Sanctioned Match and the Club will designate a Match Secretary who will assume the duties as a Trial Secretary.

#### WHY HOLD AN AKC SANCTIONED MATCH?

As mentioned previously it gives the handler and dog, club, stewards and judges the opportunity to gain valuable ring experience. Typically, handlers and dogs are more relaxed in this type of atmosphere than in an actual Trial. It gives them the opportunity to be evaluated and judged against other competitors without the pressures of an actual Trial.

Any person wishing to become an AKC Obedience Judge is required to judge a minimum of 5) novice classes at AKC sanctioned matches prior to submitting their application. A provisional Obedience Judge wishing to move up to the next class is required to judge a minimum of 5) Sanctioned Matches in the class that they are applying for. Sanctioned Matches are necessary in order for the sport to train and obtain new Judges.

AKC has a list of requirements for Clubs to hold future Dog Shows. In order to be licensed to hold a Dog Show the Club must satisfy a minimum of 3 requirements. Hosting an AKC Sanctioned Obedience Match satisfies one of those requirements.

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER A SANCTIONED MATCH?

Dogs must be AKC registered and be at least 6 months of age. Dogs with a CDX title may be entered in the Open B class but may not compete for any awards in that class. A dog with a CDX title may compete for awards in a Utility class. Dogs with a UD title may be entered in the Open B and/ or Utility classes but may not compete for any awards in these classes. The Match Secretary, and the match judges and immediate household and family members are not eligible to participate.

#### WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A CORRECTION CLINIC AND A SANCTIONED MATCH?

A Correction Clinic is held to allow a handler to <u>train</u> their dog and make suitable corrections as necessary. The Judge of a Correction Clinic may work with the handler on a specific issue, sometimes allowing the team to repeat or modify an exercise.

A Sanctioned Match is held to gain ring experience. Because AKC regulations apply at Sanctioned Matches corrections are <u>not</u> allowed. A person that corrects their dog at a Sanctioned Match will receive an NQ for that exercise as in a Trial and may be excused.

#### **HOW DO I ENTER A SANCTIONED MATCH?**

Entry to an AKC Sanctioned Match is made by submitting a completed Official Entry Form to the Match Secretary of the Club hosting the event with the proper fee. The Entry Form could be an existing printed form for any AKC Obedience Trial or is available for download from AKC at http://www.akc.org/pdfs/AEN999.pdf. The entry must be complete and include the dog's AKC registration number. Pre-entries are strongly encouraged. Entry may be available until the Sanctioned Match begins providing the classes have not filled or otherwise published.

Hopefully this explains the need and basic rules for Sanctioned Matches. If you have any questions the pamphlet "Match Regulations" is available for download from the AKC website or email obedience@FVDTC.org with your questions.

Peggy Sue Seehafer (Second Vice-President) stated that she having some difficulty securing people for the programs she has planned. As of this time, Peggy is planning a program called "So you want to shoot your dog?" She stated that the program would be discussing how to photograph their dog. She also will encourage club members who would like suggestions to improve the quality of their photography, to bring in photographs that they have taken of their dogs. She would also like to find an individual who could speak about feeding dogs the RAW diet.

Peggy also sought ideas from club members of who or what other programs she should pursue. Sandi Stephenson suggested that Peggy Sue contact Dianne Allen to discuss ring tips. Sandi stated that she heard Dianne, who is an AKC Judge and a top exhibitor, speak a couple of years ago and found it very informative.

Terri stated that she would get the contact information to Peggy Sue after it was suggested that Peggy contact the individual from HELP who was unable to speak due to illness at the September 2007 membership meeting. It was also suggested that in conjunction with a future American Red Cross Canine First Aid class to be conducted for club members we could have the class instructor speak at the May membership meeting to provide us with an overview of the class. Terri and Peggy will coordinate with the speaker and the class dates.

Sandi Stephenson (Director of Training) reported that other than the misperception that she has control over the condition of the parking lot, things are going wonderfully. She stated that she only has control of the training, NOT the parking lot. Sandi asked that trainers remember that parking by the door is not allowed, unloading only.

She also reported that the Dale will need an assistant for the 8:00 p.m. Beginner's class starting on March 13. Bill Clarke is now instructing the 4-H classes and will no longer be able to assist Dale. Sandi stated that Vera Nyberg still needs an assistant for the 8:00 p.m. Puppy class.

Terri Byerly reported that Ericka is still assisting for the 7:00 p.m. Beginner's class while Selena Larmon cares for her current litter of Labrador Retriever puppies. Terri Byerly also reported that she and Dale will swap the time that they instruct for one session for the session starting on May 29. Dale will teach at 7:00 p.m. and Terri will teach the 8:00 p.m. Beginner's class.

Although Roy Jones has provided their quote, Rick was waiting to receive the Onofrio quote prior to announcing any information. Rick stated that Superintendents will also perform the Secretary's job as well, however it is very expensive! In addition to Rick Cox judging a class, he will contact other local individuals who must judge at a AKC sanctioned match to fulfill one of the requirements to apply to the AKC to become a judge. Once he a has compiled a list of individuals, he will provide that information to the Match Committee. It was agreed that because one of the main reasons that we are hosting the sanctioned match is to assist the potential AKC judge, we would give those individuals priority to select the class they must judge. Sandi volunteered to work with Rick and then contact the club members who might have already signed up to judge for that particular class at the match.

Rick also agreed to submit an article to Waggin' Tales providing a brief description of what a sanctioned match entails.

Ingrid Hamburger (Match Steward Chairperson) was unable to attend the meeting, but sent the following report with Francene Andresen. Francene stated that stewards are needed for the Match 20th correction clinic. Any volunteers from the meeting can see Francene after the meeting to sign up. Following these suggestions will eliminate many hours of reformatting the information to display correctly in the Waggin' Tales.

Additionally, Francene stated that articles and Brags from club members are always welcomed and she personally really enjoys learning how other members are doing and looks forward to reading about training tips and new information. Even a review of old information is good as a refresher. We have some very talented people in our club who could share valuable tips from their years of experience and knowledge and the newsletter is a good source in which to connect with new trainers and those just getting into the sport.

Information about training treats and their uses


