

On Thursday, June 19<sup>th</sup> FVDTC will be hosting a Sanctioned OB Match. (OB = Obedience B) AKC recognizes several different types of Sanctioned matches (A, B, and C) but the "B" match satisfies most requirements with the least effort and is therefore the most common. A "B" match can have both breed and obedience whereas "OB" is just for obedience. Instead of our regular Correction Clinic in June we will be holding a Sanctioned Match. There will probably be some questions regarding the switch. Hopefully this article will answer those questions.

#### WHAT IS A SANCTIONED OB MATCH?

AKC defines a Sanctioned OB Obedience Match as an informal event at which dog clubs, judges, stewards, and exhibitors and their dogs gain experience needed for licensed events. AKC obedience regulations apply at Sanctioned Matches. Dog and handler teams will be scored as in an AKC Obedience Trial, however, no points or credit toward an Obedience Title are awarded. Approval from AKC is required to hold an OB Sanctioned Match and the Club will designate a Match Secretary who will assume the duties as a Trial Secretary.

#### WHY HOLD AN AKC SANCTIONED MATCH?

As mentioned previously it gives the handler and dog, club, stewards and judges the opportunity to gain valuable ring experience. Typically, handlers and dogs are more relaxed in this type of atmosphere than in an actual Trial. It gives them the opportunity to be evaluated and judged against other competitors without the pressures of an actual Trial.

Any person wishing to become an AKC Obedience Judge is required to judge a minimum of 5) novice classes at AKC sanctioned matches prior to submitting their application. A provisional Obedience Judge wishing to move up to the next class is required to judge a minimum of 5) Sanctioned Matches in the class that they are applying for. Sanctioned Matches are necessary in order for the sport to train and obtain new Judges.

AKC has a list of requirements for Clubs to hold future Dog Shows. In order to be licensed to hold a Dog Show the Club must satisfy a minimum of 3 requirements. Hosting an AKC Sanctioned Obedience Match satisfies one of those requirements.

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER A SANCTIONED MATCH?

Dogs must be AKC registered and be at least 6 months of age. Dogs with a CDX title may be entered in the Open B class but may not compete for any awards in that class. A dog with a CDX title may compete for awards in a Utility class. Dogs with a UD title may be entered in the Open B and/ or Utility classes but may not compete for any awards in these classes. The Match Secretary, and the match judges and immediate household and family members are not eligible to participate.

#### WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A CORRECTION CLINIC AND A SANCTIONED MATCH?

A Correction Clinic is held to allow a handler to <u>train</u> their dog and make suitable corrections as necessary. The Judge of a Correction Clinic may work with the handler on a specific issue, sometimes allowing the team to repeat or modify an exercise.

A Sanctioned Match is held to gain ring experience. Because AKC regulations apply at Sanctioned Matches corrections are <u>not</u> allowed. A person that corrects their dog at a Sanctioned Match will receive an NQ for that exercise as in a Trial and may be excused.

### **HOW DO I ENTER A SANCTIONED MATCH?**

Entry to an AKC Sanctioned Match is made by submitting a completed Official Entry Form to the Match Secretary of the Club hosting the event with the proper fee. The Entry Form could be an existing printed form for any AKC Obedience Trial or is available for download from AKC at http://www.akc.org/pdfs/AEN999.pdf. The entry must be complete and include the dog's AKC registration number. Pre-entries are strongly encouraged. Entry may be available until the Sanctioned Match begins providing the classes have not filled or otherwise published.

Hopefully this explains the need and basic rules for Sanctioned Matches. If you have any questions the pamphlet "Match Regulations" is available for download from the AKC website or email obedience@FVDTC.org with your questions.

## Membership Meeting Highlights May 07, 2008

Meeting brought to order at 7:59 p.m.

Carolyn Pearson (Secretary). The March Meeting minutes were approved as published. Several items of correspondence were read.

Ed Herdes (First Vice-President) reported that he plans to schedule a mat cleaning date this year. He will work with the fairgrounds to determine date. Once that date has been set, it will be well publicized.

Sandi Stephenson (Director of Training) was not at the meeting due to her work schedule, however she sent the following report as read by Carolyn Pearson.

Classes are proceeding well.

It is GREAT having the front table covered by Cheryl Hettinger.

Sandi also reminded club members that for safety purposes, there is to be no more tying dogs to tables. Handlers must crate their dogs, (or leave them in the vehicle) when they are not able to hold on to the leash. Sandi thanked Terri for making the reminder signs for this.

Sandi also announced that effective immediately, we need an instructor for the 8:00 p.m. Open class and for an assistant instructor for the 8:00 p.m. Puppy class.

Sandi also stated that Kristin Anderson will instruct the 8:00 p.m. Beginner class starting with the August session. Sandi extended big thanks to Dale Swanson, who could never really be replaced, for the time he was the instructor of that class.

Rick Cox (Obedience Trial Chairperson) reported that he received notification from AKC that the Open A/ Utility A Judge for the 2008 Obedience/Rally Trial was ineligible to judge our trial due to a time/distance conflict. According to AKC's rules, a judge cannot judge the same class within 30 days. Although we had a confirmation from the judge, the judge was scheduled to judge Open A/Utility A at another trial. Rick reported that he searched for another judge within the four connecting states, who was available AND could judge both the Open A and Utility A classes AND was on the list of suitable judges to hire. To resolve this dilemma, Rick proposed that Edree Olson be hired as the Open A judge and that Nancy DeFiesta would remain as the Utility A judge. Rick stated that he would re-address Nancy DeFiesta's contract due to the reduction in her judging assignment. Rick also reported that he contacted Donna Darland to judge Open A, however she is not yet approved for Open A. Although she is scheduled to do her interview with AKC for Open A in June, there is no guarantee that the remaining process would be completed by the obedience trial date. Taffy stated that she has e-mail confirmation messages for all 2009 judges.

Rick also announced that in spite of class-to-class 'begging', the Booths chair position for the Obedience/Rally trial is still vacant. Rick stated that this is truly an easy job because it is usually working with the Booth Chair for the Car-Dun-Al dog training club.

Taffy suggested that although we have a Trial superintendent, we should still seek a club member to be listed as a Trial Secretary in the Premium list.

Terri reported that Sue MacPherson (Membership Chairperson) dropped off a packet of applications to present at the meeting and went home with strep throat. All applicants were published in the April Waggin' Tales. Terri read the list of eight applicants. Francene made a motion to accept the list as read and published. Taffy Wille seconded the motion. The motion was approved by all members present with no one opposed or abstaining. Welcome to all new members, especially Dave DeFrank who was present at the meeting.

Ingrid Hamburger (Tracking Test Chairperson) reported that the planning is going well. She will continue the planning after she returns from her vacation.

Terri stated that a special election will be conducted at the September 3<sup>rd</sup> Membership Meeting to elect Rosemary Anderson for the Public Education Coordinator position.

Helen Castellano (Agility Trial Chairperson) reported that the fall agility trial will now be indoors. The new venue is the Robert Vaughn Athletic Center in Aurora. The AKC has approved the September 13<sup>th</sup> and

14<sup>th</sup> event, including the new site. The entries are \$24.00 for the first entry and \$14.00 for the second entry. Helen reported that Sally Gichner and Kera Holm are the judges. The opening date is July 9<sup>th</sup> and the closing date is August 27<sup>th</sup>. Helen stated that all chair positions have been filled for the Agility Trial Committee, with the exception of the Hospitality Chair. Any club members interested in the position can contact Helen at agility@fvdtc.org.

Terri expressed kudos to Cheryl Hettinger (Annual Dinner Chairperson) for doing such a super job on the Annual Dinner. Taffy stated that the favors presented to all 43 guests were phenomenal. Cheryl stated that Randy Sales and Francene Andresen were taking photographs throughout the evening. To allow all club members the opportunity to see the pictures, Cheryl planned to give Mary Szczurek, Librarian, the photographs and the CD. Cheryl Hettinger volunteered to chair the Annual Dinner next year and said she will be seeking committee members to help. Cheryl will seek input from club members whether there would be an interest in having a pizza party at a rented hall for the Annual Dinner. Cheryl thanked Rick Cox for doing a fantastic job as the emcee for the dinner. Cheryl also asked club members to loan her programs from past events. Francene Andresen and Ingrid Hamburger volunteered for next year's annual dinner committee.

Colleen Kent (CGC & TDI Test Coordinator) was not in attendance, however it was announced that the next CGC/TDI test was May 15<sup>th</sup>. The TDI evaluator is Tom Stephenson and the CGC evaluator is Terri Byerly. Terri stated that there were still spots available for the CGC test, but not the TDI test.

Terri Byerly announced that Shelly Kellums has graciously volunteered to be our Demonstrations chairperson. The jumps used for the demonstrations are currently in the shed. Francene stated that she volunteered to demonstrate tracking should the need arise.

Sandi Stephenson was not at the meeting due to her work schedule, however she sent the following report on behalf of the Match Committee Chairs (Penny Brcich/Jan Schomer/Sandi Stephenson) as read by Carolyn Pearson.

Although Sandi reported that the sanctioned match slated for June 18 was set, Rick reported that he has received the approval for the Rally match, but not the Obedience match. He stated that he will verify the approval status with AKC. Penny Brcich, Match Secretary, is handling the entries. Rick Cox is doing the judges books and sheets. Sandi extended a thank you to Rick and Penny!

Sandi also reported that the match committee would like member input regarding hosting a sanctioned match every year.

Ingrid Hamburger (Match Steward Chairperson) reported that stewards are needed for May 15<sup>th</sup> Correction Clinic. She stated that she will ask Jan Schomer to send a request for volunteers.

Buffy Cramer-Hamman (Publicity) was not in attendance, however it was announced that the brochure is ready for board approval.

Francene Andresen (Waggin' Tales Editor) reported that the next Waggin' Tales deadline is Sunday, May 11<sup>th</sup>.


