# A Therapy Award for 2015

New for 2015, FVDTC will present a Therapy Dog award, the Natalie Award, sponsored by Wendy Waddick.

To qualify: A Therapy Dog Team, one dog and one person, must be registered with a Therapy Dog organization and provide proof of their registration with this organization.

The team must keep a list of all the visits through the calendar year, January 1 - December 31. This list shall include the place that the visit occurred, the date and time of the visit and the amount of time they were there for the visit. It must also be signed by the visit coordinator. It should also include contact information of the organization that the visit occurred.

The award will be given to the Therapy Dog Team that makes the most visits in a single year. If there is a tie in the number of visits in a year, the tie will be broken by the total number of hours on site.


