Hi All,

I want to start this months note by saying thank you to everyone for following our new COVID-19 reopening guidelines. I also have a friendly reminder, please use one pump of hand sanitizer before entering any of the rings and especially before touching any of the training equipment. ## Mask Update

FVDTC has updated our mask requirements to follow the recommendations of the Center For Disease Control, or CDC

As our knowledge of the COVID-19 evolves, scientists are saying that this virus is mainly transmitted through infected respiratory droplets in the air. Our most effective tool to stop the spread of COVID-19 is wearing masks whenever you are near others, but not all masks are alike in their effectiveness. Masks are are best tool to keep each other safe and stop any possible spread of the COVID-19 virus to others.

I'm sure most everyone is already following these guidelines, but we wanted to clarify them so there is no questions about what types of masks need to be worn at training.

Therefore, we have updated our mask requirements to include:


- Masks need to be at least 2 layers of material or more
- Masks need to fit snuggly against the side of your face with no gaps
- Masks needs to be secured under your chin
- No bandannas of any type
- · No masks with any type of air vents are allowed
- Masks need to cover your nose and mouth at all times

We realize that sometimes things happen, your mask may break while you are at training, or you may forget to bring your mask. Our goal is not to send you away because of these issues. Therefore, FVDTC will be purchasing a limited supply of masks to have on hand in case you need one.
