## Board Meeting Highlights - April 12, 2021

Meeting brought to order at 7:38 p.m.

Carolyn Pearson (Secretary) Nothing to report.

**Phil Nuger (Treasurer)** distributed the YTD 2021 Statement of Activity report with the following comments:

- There is no comparison to the previous year included, as he deemed that any comparison for 2020 and the 1st half of 2021 with other years would not be meaningful.
- Total Revenue of \$29,000 looks good due primarily to the Agility Trial Entry Fees (\$19,000).

- Total Expenses of \$16,700 are understated pending the following expenses:
  - Rent for the 1st Qtr 2021 (since training on February 4) has not been calculated or paid roughly \$4,000.
  - Reimbursement for Agility Trial expenses to Cathy Fleury has yet to be submitted.
     Based on past trials, he estimates that that request will be approximately \$1,500.
  - There are no annual award expense claims yet. Historically, this has been in the \$5,000 range, but will likely be less this year.
- · Investment performance remains solid, as the

stock market continues to rise. Total assets (Cash & Investments) are valued as of 3/31/21 at about \$330,000.

Phil made a motion at the meeting to authorize the Treasurer to spend up to \$200 per year to purchase software to prepare and file the clubs annual federal tax return. The motion was seconded by Taffy Wille. Phil stated that last year, the cost was around \$80; however this year's Taxact software now costs \$130 for the software package required to prepare the required form 990. The motion was approved by all members present, with no one opposed or abstaining.

Will Short (Director of Training) reported that all the instructors for next session (starting on April 22) are confirmed. He currently has a list of five volunteers for the Conformation ring and three volunteers for the Novice/Beginner Novice run-through ring.

**Gina Post (Public Education Coordinator)** reported that she is ready to start when things return to normal with non-Covid restrictions.

**Taffy Wille (Obedience Trial Chairperson)** reported that applications have been sent to the AKC all events for our fall trial (rally and obedience). Judges panel is approved for all and attached as a PDF.

Taffy reported that she and the Judges Committee have filled our 2023 slate of judges at this time. She has the signed contract from the fairgrounds and will send a reminder to Bob Olsen to get his Trial Secretary contract. Wendy reported that the Heart Clinic will be attempted again this year and Nancy Lee will be the coordinator.

**Dave Lewis (Director at Large)** reported that approximately 1,000 folks have accessed the website in the last month. He is actively working on getting the fun match sign-up process finalized.

#### Old Business

 Online Payments – Wendy received the information from Miriam Zarate regarding Miriam's review of the Paypal application; she forwarded the information on to Dave Lewis and Phil Nuger. Neither Dave nor Phil had a chance to look at the information in detail.

- Fun Match Dave stated that he is actively working with the Match Committee and Wendy to get the fun match sign-up process finalized. It was suggested that the amount of runthrough time for the Utility and Open rings be reduced from the 15 minutes currently allowed. Wendy suggested that the stewards in those rings make a note of the starting and ending times for each exhibitor to enable us to make an informed decision about the timing. The latest time to sign-up for a fun match slot is Wednesday night at 8:00 p.m.
- Health Clinic Wendy reported that Amberleaf Animal Hospital will be able to host a Health Clinic on Thursday May 13th. Communication and a flyer will happen shortly. Carolyn will check to see if we can get the kitchen. Sue stated that the prices will remain the same as last year.

#### **New Business**

Work Credit Restrictions - It was agreed that rather than set restrictions, we will monitor the list of fun match volunteers on a case by case basis. The goal is to allow everyone the opportunity to volunteer in the best way suited for them and allow them to earn the work credits that they need for membership dues reductions or title/volunteer awards submission. If there are individuals who are signing up for an over-abundance of work credits, Taffy will speak to the individual about allowing others to sign-up first. Taffy will work with Dave to get a report generated to allow her to keep an eye on the number of times someone volunteers. (Editor's note: that report was provided the next day, but will need to be an ongoing effort.)

A motion was made, seconded and approved to adjourn the meeting at 8:14 p.m.


