

Board Meeting Highlights - December 12, 2022

Meeting brought to order at 7:30 p.m.

Carolyn Pearson (Secretary). The October Meeting minutes were approved as published. It was agreed that the request sent by AKC and IFDCO regarding the "Puppy Protection Act" will be communicated to club members via Constant Contact.

Phil Nuger (Treasurer) was not in attendance, however he provided a preliminary statement for the year, with much emphasis on the "preliminary" part. He stated that there will be some additional income recorded before the end of the year due to un-deposited class payment checks and raffle income from the obedience trial. He reported that the Obedience Trial Committee did an outstanding job of cutting the loss from the previous year by more than half.

There will also be some investment income in the Morgan Stanley Account for dividends that will need to be recorded.

With the increases in membership dues and class fees that have been put in place starting in 2023, he believes that we will be close to our break-even goal by year end 2023. He will provide a better analysis / projection after the close of the year when all 2022 revenues and expenses will be recorded.

Cathy Fleury (Agility Trial Chairperson) stated that the contracts for 2023 agility trials have been signed and forwarded to Phil for deposit checks.

Old Business

Confirmation of Location for the January 18th, 2023 Membership Meeting

Will Short asked for a final confirmation of whether the January Membership Meeting will be conducted inperson or using the Zoom on-line meeting. He stated that according to the majority of the members participating at the November membership meeting, the meeting should be conducted online. However, it was considered to be a poll, not a motion with a vote. Additionally, it was felt that the number of members at the meeting was not a big representation of the total club members.

In response to club members' question during the November meeting, Dave reported to the Board that we do not have the proper technology needed to have effective hybrid meetings, where participants can attend either on-line or in-person. The pros and cons of the online vs. in-person meetings were

Online Meeting Pros

- the unpredictability of winter weather would not be a factor,
- the time needed for driving to the location,
- the amount of space of the room compared to the number of individuals present,

In-Person Meeting Pros

- the ability to better control side conversations at the in-person meeting (making note taking a little easier)
- the ability to socialize with fellow club members face-to-face.

After much discussion, Sue MacPherson made a motion to host the January 2023 Membership Meeting inperson at the Kane County Extension Center. Carolyn Pearson seconded the motion.

It was also suggested that since January is the annual meeting with a typically larger-than-average attendance, it would be a good opportunity to get the general membership's feedback regarding ongoing online meetings.

- Serve on a Committee for one year


FOUR credits:

- *Assistant Instructor for Drop-In Classes for one quarter
- *Primary Instructor for Conformation Class for one quarter
- *Primary Instructor for Registered Class for one session

- Serve as Registered Class coordinator for one year
- Serve as a Board Member for one year
- Chairperson of a Committee for one year
- Serve as Kane County 4-H Coordinator for one year
- Serve as Kane County 4-H Dog Projects Superintendent for one year
