

IT'S AWARDS TIME!!

(The following is a summary of the full letter. Anyone who wishes to receive the complete package, who did <u>not</u> attend three membership meetings in 1994, please contact Taffy Wille at 708-897-7673)

Our annual AWARDS DINNER is scheduled for Saturday, March 11, 1995, at Long Island Sound on New York Street in Aurora. We hope that all of you will join us for an enjoyable evening and to honor those who will be receiving awards for 1994.

If for some reason you have not met ALL your requirements (i.e., attended three membership meetings, worked at three events, and trained your dog at the club) and can justify the reason, your eligibility will be reviewed by the Board of Directors.

It is the policy of FVDTC to give awards and patches for AKC titles, earned at trials, tests or shows, where AKC recognized breeds are able to participate. For example: Obedience, Tracking, and Breed, specifically CD, CDX, UD, UDX, OTCH, TD, TDX, CH, or international equivalents. All other titles or degrees conferred by the AKC or an AKC sanctioned Breed Club will receive a certificate of recognition.

Awards are given for titles earned in 1994 (i.e., a dog may have earned two "legs" toward a title in 1993, but if the third "leg" was earned in 1994, the title is earned in 1994). However, scores for ALL other awards must have been earned in the current year.

Patches are given designating the title earned.

Members owning mixed breed dogs are eligible for a Certificate of Merit for the equivalent of AKC titles earned at MATCHES. Submit at least 3 qualifying score sheets signed by three different judges. This also applies to pure-bred dogs that are not registered by the AKC.

If your dog gets a Dog World Award in 1994, please give this information to Bev Nicholson as soon as you know that you have earned one, as it takes about 2 months to process these certificates.

All information must be postmarked no later than January 7, 1995. There will be absolutely no exceptions to this rule!

Then you cross the Rainbow Bridge together, never again to be separated.




