Peekaso, an abstract dog

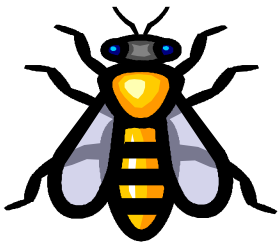
Terrier + Bulldog = Terribull, a

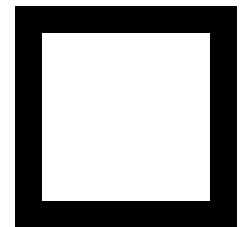
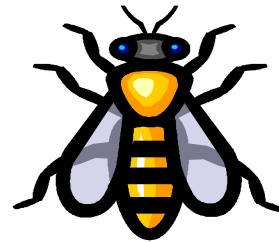
- * Chicago: Dog Beach

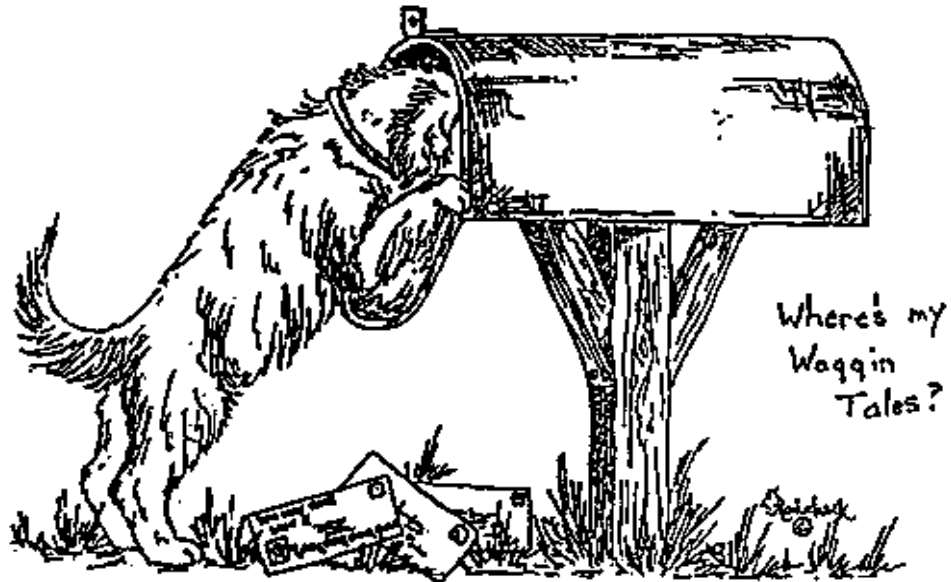
