Board Meeting Highlights

Board Meeting Highlights April 7, 1999

Meeting brought to order at 7:45 p.m.

Joan Payne gave a report for the Annual Banquet, past and future. She has not heard too many complaints other than it was a long night. One way of shortening the amount of time for next year, the cocktails could be from 6:00 until 6:30, with dinner beginning promptly at 6:30. program could begin during the dessert course. Joan would also like to have the table containing the awards in a more centrally located position. She felt that the awards presentation was nicely done. She thought the personal touches that Rick offered as the Master of Ceremonies should be preserved for future banquets. One aspect that may be changed for next years banquet is the order of the awards presentation. It will either be done as it was this past year, or done in the order of titles (e.g. all individuals who have earned an AKC CD would be awarded together, etc.). Joan will be looking for feedback from the club members regarding the titles awarded, etc. by May 15th. Joan would like to continue several things, including the program with the pictures, the proud dog write-ups. The Boner awards were great. Joan stated that a "Boner box" will be available at training nights to all club members to nominate fellow club members. Joan will be collecting them and turning them over to Ronnie Bizer (recipient of last year's award) to determine the Boner Award winner and presentation of the runner's up for the award. The location for next year's dinner has not yet been determined. There will be a meeting of the committee on April 26th at 7:00 at the Colonial restaurant.

Carolyn Pearson (Secretary). The February Meeting Minutes were approved as published. Several items of correspondence read.

Cindy Pakenas (Second Vice-President) reported that the demonstration for the Anderson Animal Shelter's Canines, Crafts and Critters will be on Saturday, April 17th at 3:00 p.m. at the Kane County Fairgrounds.

Cindy also reported that the club, through Kay Weber, has received an invitation to conduct three one hour demonstrations for the St. Charles Scarecrow Festival on October 9th and 10th. We would need to have enough

volunteers for a demonstration at 11:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m.. The demonstrations would be outside under tent. A discussion ensued as to the type of demonstrations that would be interesting for the audience. It was agreed that this would be a great way to introduce the club to the public. It was suggested that the demonstrations be different at each time and should be a combination of obedience for the housepet and obedience competition. All of the board members felt that it was a great opportunity and should not be passed-up. This will require a large number of volunteers. Anyone interested in participating should contact Cindy Pakenas at (630) 377-6250.

The picnic will be on July 18th, in conjunction with the Agility match. Cathy Fleury volunteered to bring her zippered screen tent to use to hold the food.

Cathy Fleury (Treasurer) reported that the club has money. She is still reviewing our contract with the fairgrounds to determine whether we are liable for the damage done to the door automatic closer. The damage was done during the severe wind storm last winter.

Carolyn Pearson made a motion to donate \$50.00 to Anderson Animal Shelter in memory of Julie Brandon. That would be in addition to the money collected from the club members. Cathy Fleury seconded the motion, it was approved by all, no one opposed or abstained. The entire amount sent will be \$67.00.

Taffy Wille and Carolyn Pearson (Acting: Directors of Training) stated that things are going well. While looking for instructors for the current session, some names of individuals who are willing to help for the summer session #3 have been obtained. Most of the current Beginner's instructors "take a break" during the summer. This year the booth rental fee will be the same as last years, but will include only one table. Additional tables will be available for \$5.00 each. Car-Dun-Al will be charging the same fees. The trial has been approved by the AKC. However we are still awaiting judges approval.

Dave Lewis (Waggin' Tales Editor) reported that the deadline may be late due to an upcoming business trip. Sally Compton will again be able to pick-up and distribute the newsletters at training.

The website is slowly progressing. He is currently awaiting the internet registration to be finalized.

Sandy Walsh (Graduation Chairperson) sent the following report with Carolyn. She will need three volunteers to judge for the next graduation on Tuesday, May 18th.

Judy Anderson (Membership Chairperson) reported that she has been receiving membership dues already.

Heather King (Tracking Secretary) was not in attendance. Carolyn reported that she received a copy of the letter that Heather sent to the AKC regarding the necessity of canceling the VST scheduled for May 23rd. 
