The Ovarian Cancer Symptom Awareness Organization is a wonderful organization with a very interesting aspect that involves the fantastic ability of our dogs to help humans.

Wendy thanked Peggy Seehafer for making the arrangements for the informative presentation.

Carolyn Pearson (Secretary). The January Meeting minutes were approved as published. A lot of correspondence was read.
