We had another TDI Therapy dog test during our June Fun Match. A big thank you to Ren Stewart, who coordinated this test, and evaluator John Grosse, plus all the many volunteers for making this another successful test. There were 6 teams that tested and all passed. Congratulations to all the new TDI Therapy Dog Teams!

We are now half way through 2019; have you been working on your work credits for this year yet? Remember, you need at least 3 work credits to qualify for a 50 percent reduction in your yearly dues and 10 work credits to qualify for a volunteer or new title award. Talk to any Committee Chairperson to learn how you can volunteer and earn your work credits. You can also earn credits by attending membership meetings, up to 3 per year. Attending membership meetings is also a great way to keep up to date with all that is happening in your club.

Speaking of work credits, we have a great volunteer opportunity, we need a new front desk person during the 6:00pm through 7:00pm hour. There will be on-thejob training for a dedicated person who can man the front desk on a weekly basis. This is a great way to earn your work credits and help out your club! FVDTC will be offering several health clinics in the coming months. The first clinic will be a Taurine Blood Draw Clinic. This clinic will be held during regular training on the evening of Tuesday October 8th. This blood draw is to check for any possible taurine deficiencies, which can be a cause of dilated cardiomyopathy, or enlarged heart in dogs. It is believed that a grain free diet maybe the cause of taurine deficiencies. The cost is \$96 per dog. For more information contact Donna Bihner. FVDTC will also be offering another heart clinic during our fall obedience/rally trial on Saturday, November 16th. Heidi Kellihan DVM, DACVIM a Clinical Associate Professor of Cardiology, Board Certified Cardiologist at the University of Wisconsin-Madison will be once again performing the exams for us. The next clinic being offered at FVDTC is an OFA Eye Clinic during the evening of Thursday October 3rd during regular training, starting at 5:00pm. The exams will be performed by Denise M. Lindley DVM of Animal Eye Consultants. The cost is \$35 per dog. You must pre register. See the article in this newsletter for more information. OFA Eye Exam

FVDTC will hold an OFA Eye Exam on the evening of Thursday October 3rd, 2019 during regular training, at the Kane County Fairgrounds. Exams will be held between 5:00pm and 9:00pm. This is a fantastic opportunity to get your dog's eyes examined at a greatly reduced fee! Plus it is highly recommended that you get your dog's eyes examined yearly.

Denise M. Lindley DVM of Animal Eye Consultants will be performing the eye exams. The cost is \$35 per dog.

**Please include the preferred time that you would like for your arrival, your dog's name and breed, and your preferred contact information. The exams will be approximately a half hour after your arrival. You need to arrive a half hour before the exam time in order to get eye drops placed in your dog's eyes so they are dilated for the exam, and to fill out paperwork. Bring your dog's AKC registration information the night of exams to make filling out paperwork easier.

Get your reservations and fees in early to get your preferred time slot! There may be a limited number

night of testing exams available, at a cost of \$40 per dog. Night of examination spots are not guaranteed.

There will be no refunds of examination fees starting two weeks prior to the examine date.
