IT'S AWARDS TIME 2024!

Congratulations! If you are filling out award forms then you must have earned one or more new titles in 2023! It is the policy of FVDTC to give awards for AKC, CKC and UKC titles earned at trials, tests or shows each year. To receive a club award, you must have a total of **10** work credits for the year and be listed as a Regular Training Member in the Roster. If for some reason you have not met **ALL** your requirements and can justify the reason, your eligibility will be reviewed by the Board of Directors.

Contained is this packet is a form for individual awards, as well an application for the club's Special Awards. Please review each item in the following list before you begin.

- Each form must be completely filled out and <u>please</u> print clearly so we can read your information.
- Please submit **one** Family/Individual Work Credit Form plus **one** Award Application Form for **each** dog. If Spot and Fido each earned a title, then two Award Applications should be submitted with one Work Credit Form.
- Work credits can be earned by anyone in the family.
- A dog is limited to receiving one AKC award per level of titles received. For example, if your dog earns a CD and an RA, you may pick only one award at Level 2. The exception to this, is anyone who receives a title at the highest level in the same year (OTCH and a MACH).
- Awards are given for titles earned in 2023 (i.e., a dog may have earned two "legs" toward a title prior to 2023, but if the third "leg" was earned in 2023, the title is earned in 2023). However, all scores for any of the "Special Club Awards" must have been earned in 2023.
- Please print clearly on the 2023 FVDTC Annual Awards form. The Awards Committee wants your awards to be correct, so a clearly filled out form will help the committee achieve that goal.

PLEASE NOTE:

All photos submitted for an award MUST be <u>clear</u> and <u>close-up and should be emailed, actual prints are usually not</u> <u>necessary</u>. Airbrushed awards by Bill McGuffey require an article of clothing, which must be no less than 50% cotton and must be washed at least once. The clothing cannot have pleats, seams or sewn-in folds where the picture is to be painted. All of our artists need time to provide their best work, therefore the submission deadline will NOT be extended. PLEASE be considerate and meet or beat the deadline.



Fun Match Updates

The Match Committee had a meeting recently, discussing multiple topics, not the least of which was how we can make the night more seamless for everyone. We acknowledge that things may seem pretty haphazard from the exhibitor's and judge's side of things, and even though we have a plan, gate entries can (and generally do) change all of that at the last minute.

Entrants: We will generally have one, dated, gate entry sheet for each ring.

- If entries for a specific class are growing, we will divvy the entries up and make 2 sheets, for two rings and two judges. Remember, these sheets will be dated. That way we will know we're looking at current info.
- Sheets will be held at the check in table until 7PM, then distributed to their rings.
 Exhibitors, please check yourselves in upon arriving by placing a check by your name. If you're a gate entrant, sign your name and dog (with jump height where applicable), and again place a check mark by your name.

Stewards, we know you have a super tough job.

- We appreciate you answering the call month after month!
- Please do your best to take exhibitors in the order they appear on your gate entry sheet. People will often either be tied up, or not present after having signed up (in which case there will not be a check by their name). Just begin at the first entrant. If they're not available, move on to the second entrant. Word to the wise: we'd caution against planning too far ahead. Line up one or two consecutive exhibitors and hold there. Getting too far ahead will just cause problems, and that way if you have to skip over someone because they're busy in another ring, you'll be able to bounce back more quickly to pick them up. Promising someone exactly when they'll be in, unless it's "next", is a recipe for trouble!
- Please return gate entry sheets to the front table at the end of the night.

Judges, we thank you for your dedication and hard work!

- Your efforts help keep the match down to a controlled level of chaos, and we know sometimes you have to guide new stewards. We appreciate the on the job training.
- A request from the equipment folks: to help keep the mats clean we're going to ask you to use painters tape or stickers to mark anything you need to on the mats. Supplies will be provided. The chalk is very hard to remove and it requires spray cleaner, and not just the sweeping the mats get weekly. If you use chalk, please get the spray cleaner and clean it up before you leave.
- Also, we're going to start labeling the rings specifically by judge name so there won't be any confusion about which ring you're working in.

Exhibitors, we know this night can be stressful whether it's because you're new, you're rushing from work, or you're entered multiple times.

Please be patient with all the workers as they're largely volunteers doing the best they can on any given
night. If you're having a problem, ask one of the Match Committee members and we will help sort it out. You
might just get a long and complicated explanation that will make you see the situation is more convoluted
than you thought! The Match Committee is Pat Senne (match), Sandi Stephenson (judges), Barb Misch
(stewards) and Anne Stuessy (entries).

We are sure that if everyone can work together with patience and understanding, Match night can be fun for everyone!!

Board Meeting Highlights - October 14, 2023

Meeting brought to order at 7:06 p.m.

Carolyn Pearson (Secretary), the August Meeting minutes were approved as published.

Bob Boeke (First Vice-President) was not in attendance, but reminded everyone that mat cleaning is scheduled for Saturday, October 21. The start time is 8:30 AM.

Phil Nuger (Treasurer) distributed the following year to date financial reports.

- Statement of Activity Comparison (2022 vs. 2023)
- Statement of Financial Position
- Statement of Activity Comparison Agility Trial (2022 vs. 2023)

Phil stated that the total revenue is approximately \$6,800 ahead of last year. The Guest Training revenue is approximately double the 2022 numbers. Agility trial revenue is up over 2022. Although the Tracking Test is not a big revenue generator, it is not a big expense drain.

Will Short (Director of Training) reported that Jacquie Clasen is the new 6:00 PM Beginner's class assistant. He also reported that he needs five conformation instructors to completely fill the classes until the end of the year. He stated that he has heard from several exhibitors who felt that recently that the conformation class is too large to be comfortable.

Taffy Wille (Obedience Trial Chairperson) reported that the Hospitality Committee is currently making the hotel arrangements for judges. She also reported that online signups are available and there are many, many openings for volunteers.

Wendy Waddick (Director at Large) stated that she had nothing to report.

Old Business

Donna Nuger stated that she plans to host another meeting at 6:30 PM for 1 hour prior to the November 8th Membership meeting. 
